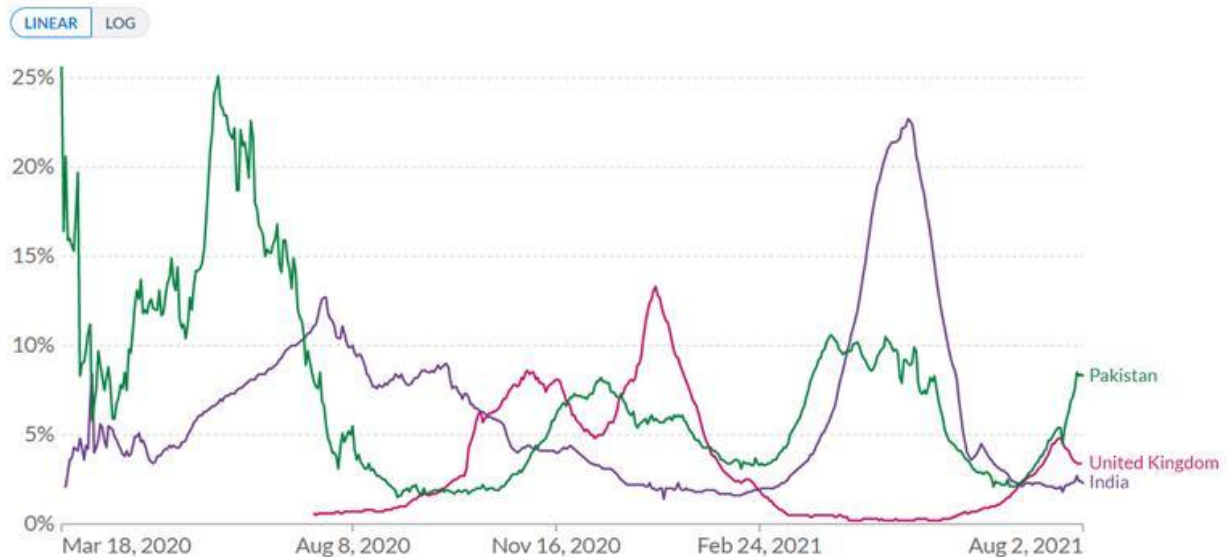


- The positivity rate in Pakistan has risen to 8pc as compared to just 2.4pc in India.
- The number of cases in Pakistan was 7.1 cases per 100k population in the week to 26 July but has now doubled to 14.4 cases per 100k population in the week to 3 August.
- As of 17 July (the most recent data available), in Pakistan, 2% of the population were fully vaccinated and a further 8% had received their first dose. By comparison in India, as of 4 August, 8% of the population are fully vaccinated and a further 20% have received their first dose.

The share of daily COVID-19 tests that are positive

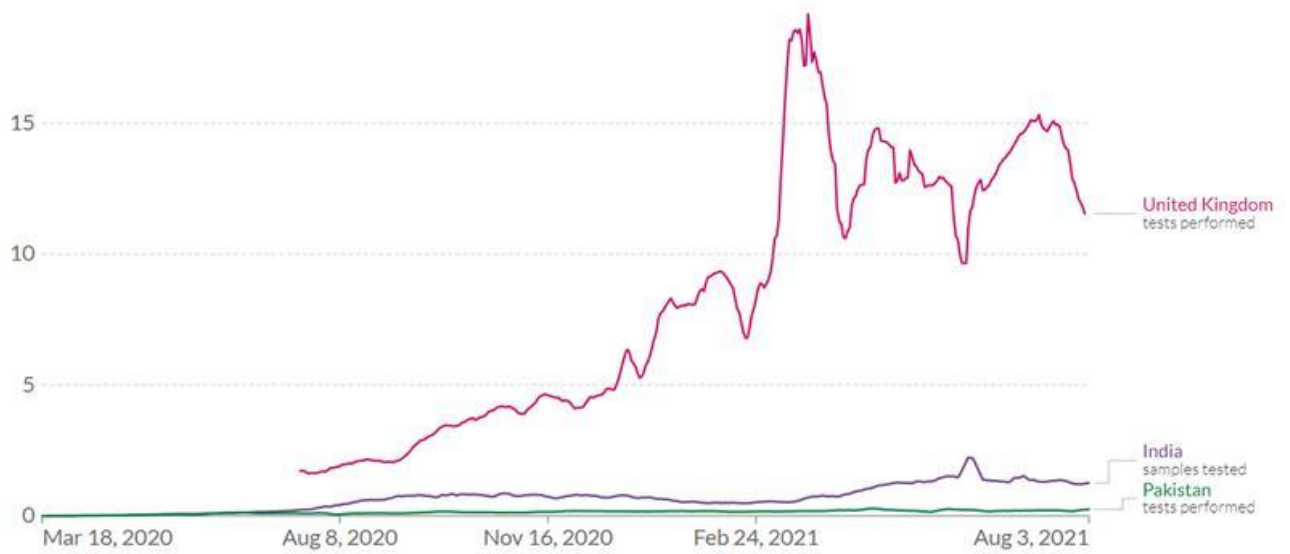
